U9 Program OHF Pilot Group Overview

TCMHL will provide a tiered MD league for associations for U9. The MD league is intended to operate in partnership with your associations commitment to opportunity-based programming. Associations may partner the MD league program with internal commitments to their additional development program.

For the 2024/2025 Season the U9MD1 group will participate in a full ice pilot program that will be implemented by the OHF.

- MD League will be divided into one group with first entry teams and game play is based on the following priorities:
 - Geographic areas
 - Tiering options/association entries
 - Facility and partnering between associations

****Please note some exceptions may be required due to association/league needs***

- Rules for game play will be communicated annually and sent to associations by your OMHA Regional Director
- Hockey Canada Pathways and OHF/OMHA communicated Seasonal Structures and Objectives are the foundation for the TCMHL programming model.
- Program models will be reviewed annually and in consultation with associations

U9 MD Season Summary- Full Ice Pilot Group MD First Entry Teams

Prep/Evaluation & Development Phase
Sept 3rd to Oct 20th 2024

- Prep Skates (min 4)
- Evaluations (min 3 prior to tiering)
- Focus on Skills/Development
- Up to 6 Exhibition Games- (Starting Sept 20) may be used in reg season/end of season phase

Regular Season Phase- Full Ice
Oct 21st to Jan 15th 2025

- Full ice games
- 10 games
- Seasonal break at Christmas

End of Season Phase
Jan 15th to March 31st 2025

- Full Ice Games
- **18 games total** composed as follows:
- **12 games (plus 6 Ex games)**
- TCMHL U9 Championship (March 28-30)

Notes:

- Tiering of players grouped by like skill & placed in groups for game play (based on association submissions)
- On-going monitoring of pods/game match ups
- iPad/Game Sheet Inc used for Full Ice Games, Scores & Standings kept
- 3 tournaments post Jan 10th (no jamboree Pre Jan 10th)
- Seasonal Break –Dec 23rd 2024 to Jan 4th 2025
- **TCMHL Development Phase tiering evaluation/kick off week/weekend Oct 19-28th 2024 pending interest approval of TCMHL associations TBD**
 - 2 exhibition games per team split cost of games to the host centres.
- Year End TCMHL Championship Weekend: **March 28th-30th under review Alternative date April 5/6th 2025**
 - Interested hosts to email Tri-County President and OMHA Regional Director by Oct 15th 2024 (host sharing between associations option)
 - Costing per team and event overview to be provided as part of host interest submission
 - Each team to play min 3 games (championship game 4th game)
 - Pizza Lunch and Team Beverages (between Saturday Games)
 - Team medallions provided by TCMHL for all participants

U9 Full Ice Game Play and Scheduling

Highlights

- Games played outside TCMHL scheduled regular/end of season require travel permits
- All tournaments require travel permits (excluding TCMHL Year End Show Case)
- Pod's will be finalized based on association interest and may be adjusted prior or during the season to ensure tiering by like skill is optimized
- Flexibility built into game scheduling for additional exhibition games

Full Ice Game Play:

- 4x6 nets required for U9 full ice games
- 3 min warm up (option for 5 min if ice time permits)
- 10-10-15 period lengths (no buzzers ice time permitted) 10-10-10 alternative
- Traditional full ice playing rules in effect
- Black pucks used for full ice games
- Affiliation U9 to U9 throughout the season, U9 to U10/U11 permitted after Jan 15th only
- Game Sheet Inc/iPads used for all full ice games

Decision Points Confirmed:

- Scheduling of games will be completed by Tri-County League Scheduler in partnership with league schedulers, note all exhibition games are booked by association schedulers.
- March Break regular season games may be scheduled if mutually agreed to by both associations
- ***Competition PODS -Adjustments may be required in season to align groups by like skill***

Decision Points Pending Confirmation:

- Year end participation in TCMHL Kick off/Championship optional, associations must communicate by Oct 31st 2024 of their participation.
