

U7/U8 & U9 PROGRAMMING Tri-County Minor Hockey League 2024/2025 Seasonal Structure MD

Revised August 12, 2024



TCMHL will provide a tiered MD league for associations for U7,U8 & U9. The MD league is intended to operate in partnership with your associations commitment to opportunity-based programming. Associations may partner the MD league program with internal commitments to their additional development program.

- MD League will be divided into "pods" based on the following priorities:
 - Geographic areas
 - Tiering options/association entries
 - Facility and partnering between associations

*Please note some exceptions may be required due to association/league needs

- Rules for game play will be communicated annually and sent to associations by your OMHA Regional Director
- Hockey Canada Pathways and OHF/OMHA communicated Seasonal Structures and Objectives are the foundation for the TCMHL programming model.
- Program models will be reviewed annually and in consultation with associations

Flexibility built into game scheduling for additional exhibition games

Game Play:

- Foam dividers or boards to divide the ice at centre red line
- Small nets required for U7 (if association is unable to provide nets smaller than 4x6 they must advised TCMHL & Regional Director in advance of program start date)
- 3 min warm up (option for 5 min if ice time permits)
- Max game time 60 mins, two 22 run time periods
- Face offs to start each half
- 4 on 4 hockey two game model (in the event of low numbers have the option to run 3 on 3 alternative or 1 half ice game model alternative)
- Visiting team switches ends at intermission
- Buzzers set to 2 mins (90 secs optional alternative if deemed developmentally appropriate for the group)
- Blue pucks required
- Tagging up is required when double shifting of players is needed as a result of low numbers (coaches must ensure all players have opportunity to double shift)
- On ice Officials (min 1 required, if association is unable to provide alternative option for supervision must be approved by TCMHL & OMHA Regional Director)
- Game flow and penalties to be implemented as per page 18-19 of U7 Hockey Canada Pathway
- Participation sheets must be used and submitted to U8 Convenor by the following submission dates:
 - November 30th 2024
 - February 28th 2025
 - March 31st 2025

U9 Half Ice & Full Ice Game Play and Scheduling

- Games played outside TCMHL scheduled regular/end of season require travel permits
- All Jamborees/tournaments require travel permits (excluding TCMHL Year End Show Case)
- Pod's will be finalized based on association interest and may be adjusted prior or during the season to ensure tiering by like skill is optimized
- Flexibility built into game scheduling for additional exhibition games
- Smaller nets recommended for U9 half ice games (full size permitted)
- 3 min warm up (option for 5 min if ice time permits)
- Max game time 60 mins, two 22 run time periods for Half Ice Games
- Face offs to start each half
- 4 on 4 hockey two game model (in the event of low numbers direct option to run 3 on 3 alternative or 1 half ice game model alternative)
- Visiting team switches ends at intermission
- Buzzers set to 1 min

Half Ice Game Play:

- Tagging up is required when double shifting of players is need as a result of low numbers (coaches to ensure all players have opportunity to double shift)
- On ice Officials required (min 1 required, if association is unable to provide alternative option for supervision must be approved by TCMHL & OMHA Regional Director)
- Game flow and penalties to be implemented as per page 21 of U9 Hockey Canada Pathway
- Participation sheets must be used and submitted to U9 Convenor by the following submission dates:
 - November 30th 2024
 - January 31st 2025



U9 Full Ice Game Play and Scheduling

Full Ice Game Play:

- 4x6 nets required for U9 full ice games
- 3 min warm up (option for 5 min if ice time permits)
- 10-10-15 period lengths (no buzzers)
- Traditional full ice playing rules in effect
- Black pucks used for full ice games
- Affiliation U9 to U9 throughout the season, U9 to U10/U11 permitted after Jan 12th for full ice phase only
- Game Sheet Inc/iPads used for all full ice games

Decision Points Confirmed:

- Scheduling of games will be completed between ice-schedulers to support facility and association partnerships, One DB divisions/scheduling initial set up to be completed by Tri-County League Scheduler.
- March Break regular season games may be scheduled if mutually agreed to by both associations
- ZOOM call hosted Sept 2024 for coaches/managers
- Competition PODS -Adjustments may be required in season to align groups by like skill

Decision Points Pending Confirmation:

• Year end participation in TCMHL Kick off/Championship optional, associations must communicate by Sept 15th 2024 of their participation.
